Maha sugar output set to be lowest in 4 yrs after dry Aug

Sugar output in Maharashtra, the top producing state, is likely to fall 14 per cent in the 2023-2024 crop year to its lowest in four years due to lower cane yields following the driest August in more than a century, officials told Reuters on Wednesday. The western state of Maharashtra could produce 9 million metric tons in this season, down from 10.5 million tons last year, said BB Thombare, president of the West Indian Sugar Mills Association.
