

Sugar up as Brazil currency dips

London, June 3

Raw sugar futures on ICE edged up on Tuesday as Brazil's real currency recovered slightly after its recent slide to a two-month low against the dollar while arabica coffee prices eased. ICE July raw sugar rose 0.07 cents or 0.4 per cent to 17.25 cents a pound lb. Liffe August white sugar futures were up \$0.90 or 0.2 per cent at \$468.40 per tonne. July arabica coffee futures on ICE were off 2.50 cents or 1.45 percent at \$1.6985 per lb. ICE July cocoa was down \$3 or 0.1 per cent at \$3,066 per tonne
